

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

Every year students must complete a new Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and submit it to the United States Department of Education for processing. **You do not have to be enrolled full time (12 hours) to receive federal aid.** Generally you will be eligible for federal aid if enrolled at least half time (8 quarter hours) and are meeting [satisfactory academic progress requirements](#). The FAFSA is an application for the following federal aid programs:

- Pell Grant
- SEOG (Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant)
- State Grants
- Subsidized Student Loan
- Unsubsidized Student Loan
- Parent Plus Loan

The FAFSA is used to determine if a student qualifies for federal financial aid. You will need to have certain financial documents available in order to apply, which may include the following:

- Federal Income Tax Return of Student and/or Spouse
- Federal Income Tax Return of Parent(s) (for dependent students)
- Documentation of other income such as Social Security benefits, Veterans Benefits, Child Support, etc.
- Huntington Junior College's OPEID (Federal School Code) is: 009047

Students and Parents should apply for an individual US Department of Education PIN number. The PIN number allows students and parents to electronically sign the FAFSA. If you do not have a PIN, you can apply at www.pin.ed.gov.
